About The Program

The Associate of Arts degree in elementary education at Wayne County Community College District (WCCCD) provides a strong academic foundation, school-based experiences, and the knowledge and skills necessary for students to transfer and succeed at a four year college/university. By continuing their studies at a college, students will earn a bachelor's degree and a provisional elementary Michigan teaching certificate. This program is designed to prepare prospective elementary teachers to be innovative role models and leaders in southeastern Michigan schools.

Admission Requirements

Students are required to complete the following:

- Fulfill all WCCCD admissions requirements.
- Declare intent to enter the TEP by completing a TEP intent application form. Fulfill course placement requirements based on the COMPASS test.
- Successfully complete 18 semester hours by taking these courses (or approved equivalents) with a minimum grade of C or better, including:
 - ENG 110 English I
 - HIS 249 U.S. History I 1607-1865
 - or -
 - HIS 250 U.S. History II 1865 to Present
 - MAT 113 Intermediate Algebra
 - PS 101 American Government
 - PSY 101 Introductory Psychology
 - SPH 101 Fundamentals of Speech
- Earn and maintain a minimum overall 2.5 grade point average.
- Submit a completed TEP application for admission along with other supporting documentation as specified in the application.
- Schedule a personal interview with a TEP staff member.
- Participate in a TEP orientation workshop.
