About The Program

A Central Service Technician is responsible for the procurement of surgical supplies and equipment. The technician provides support to all patient care services in a healthcare facility. This individual is responsible for decontaminating, cleaning, processing, assembling, sterilizing, storing and distributing the medical devices and supplies needed in patient care, especially during surgery. With the ever-expanding technological advancements in medical supplies, instrumentation, medical devices and equipment, highly trained individuals are needed in the field of central service.

Admission Requirements

Students are admitted to the program each year for the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters. Students must have Program approval, a completed application, and other required information submitted by the due date. If there are openings after the application deadline, any remaining openings will be filled on a "first-come" basis to qualified applicants.

Students are required to complete the following:

- Be 18 years of age and have a high school diploma or GED (copy required).
- Submit official transcripts from previous institution(s) attended.
- Fulfill course placement requirements based on COMPASS score.
- Complete all prerequisites with a grade of "C" or better in each course.
- Submit physical examination on District's form.
- Show proof of immunization against Hepatitis B, or declare intent to receive or decline immunization upon admission.
- Pass required sections of the Health Occupations Basic Entrance Test (HOBET). For information regarding test dates and registration procedures, contact the Director of Career Planning and Placement at 313-496-2522.
- Submit three letters of recommendation: two professional and one personal.
- Meet with Program Director.
