COR 105 Introduction to Correctional Counseling

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The course will differentiate between normal and criminal behavior. Discussions will include psychological influences as it relates to behavior as well as the role of environment and the family on behavior. Various correctional intervention strategies will be discussed. Course needed to satisfy the requirements to become a State of Michigan Corrections Officer.

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will:

- 1. Demonstrate the knowledge gained through training, and course interactions to successfully complete all MLEOTC and MCOTC requirements
- 2. Explain basic correctional department rules, regulations, policies and procedures
- 3. State the functions of the sub-entices of the criminal justice system
- 4. State the functions of ranks and positions in the law enforcement/corrections hierarchy
- 5. Explain the historical and philosophical development of corrections
- 6. Explain the constitutional rights of correctional officers and offenders
- 7. Explain predictions for the future that have an impact on corrections
- 8. Differentiate between normal and criminal behavior
- 9. Identify the impact of early environment on behavior
- 10. Identify specific problems related to the offender
- 11. Describe the role substance abuse has on the criminal pattern
- 12. Explain specific sexual problems related to offenders
- 13. Identify specific medical problems that relate to offenders
- 14. Define medical disorders that relate to offenders including emotional and social disorders, psychotic, dangerous, and labeling concerns
- 15. Identify the characteristics of institutionalization
- 16. List treatment and control community alternatives to institutionalization



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- 17. Trace the human development of juvenile offenders
- 18. Trace the human development of a young adult offender
- 19. Describe the biological impact as it relates to behavior
- 20. Describe the psychological impact as it relates to behavior
- 21. Describe criminal life style
- 22. Define social roles and responsibility
- 23. Describe the role of environment as an influence on behavior
- 24. Describe the role family has as an influence on behavior
