COURSE DESCRIPTION: This is a course dealing with the rights and responsibilities of aliens and issues involved in representing them before the INS and in the courts. Emphasis on federal immigration law and policy.

- Explain the nature of federal agencies and their relationships to the 3 branches.
- Explain the source of agency authority and the nature of agency functions.
- Describe applicable legal rules and principles and make effective arguments in the various areas of immigration law.
