

Dental Assisting

Each year, students graduate from the Dental Assisting Program and are provided with the necessary knowledge and skills to become competent Dental Assistants who can perform a variety of tasks in multiple dental settings. The program also seeks to provide a high-quality, low-cost education in a multi-cultural community. Upon completion, graduates are eligible to take a national assessment through the Dental Assisting National Board to become a Certified Dental Assistant and a state assessment through the State of Michigan Bureau of Professional Licensing to become a Registered Dental Assistant. Below you will find the outcomes of the last 2 years.
