


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

WCCCD staff attended the annual Educational Opportunity Association Conference, which is part of the Midwest Association of TRIO and College Access and Success Programs.









Mary Ellen Stempfle University Center Smart Technology Upgrade





FEEDBACK THAT HELPS

A friend of mine has a niece who recently graduated from college with a four-year degree. Given about half of her educational experience occurred during COVID, he wanted to reward the achievement with a gift of money. He concluded that the length of time that passed and the way she acknowledged the gift was due to a lack of teaching of good manners.

We all need character models and the teaching of good experiences so we can grow out of immature patterns of behavior. Learning how and what to communicate as a professional is something that generally needs to be taught and can be learned. Learning how to resolve conflicts with others is another invaluable skill that can also be taught and learned.

One of the most effective ways to learn these skills is through a good 'feedback loop,' notes Henry Cloud in Integrity. An effective feedback loop can raise our awareness about our actions, provide feedback to improve, and help to monitor the new changes. That way we are internalizing not only the new skill, but the awareness and self-correction that is necessary for good performance. When supervisors are successful at providing an effective feedback loop, employees grow and thrive.


