Dr. CharMaine Hines attended the Mayor of Detroit's Career and Education Advisory Council Meeting, of which she is an appointed member representing the District.


























Dual Enrollment Program


The Dual Enrollment Team assisted students at Frontier International Academy with completing their WCCCD graduation applications for Spring 2024.




What's Trending: Criminal Justice


Fire Department - Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC)
