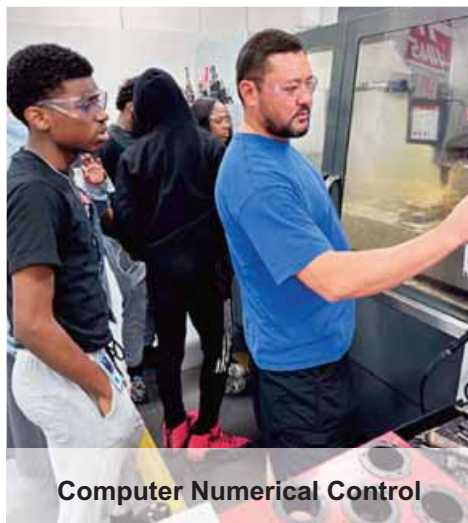

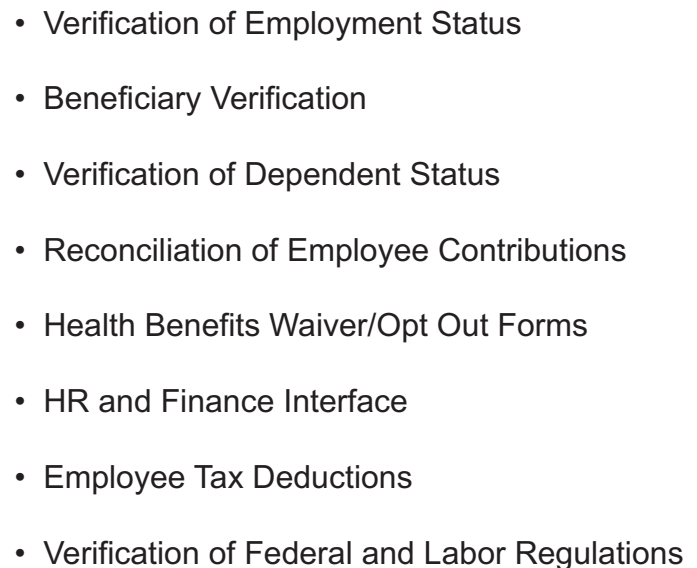

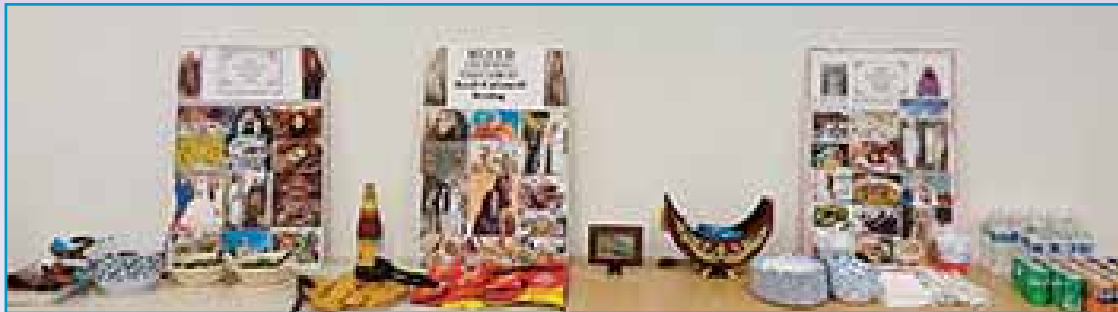


CULTURAL ENRICHMENT

Project Kickoff

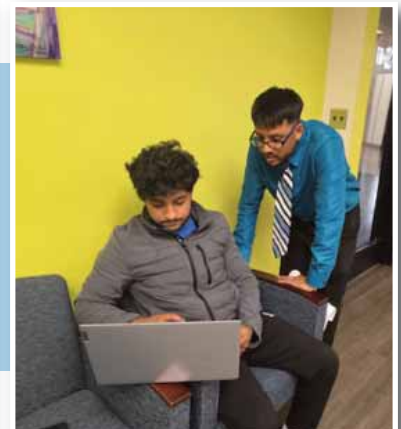

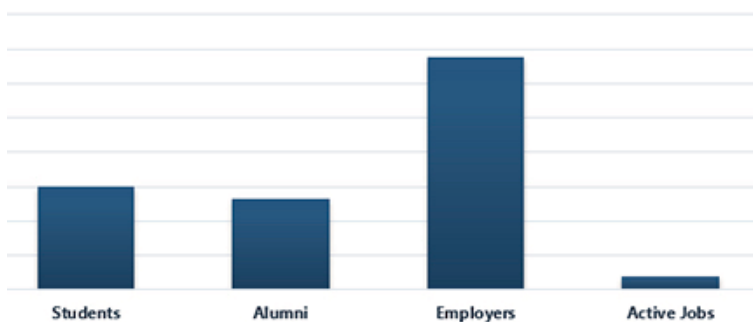

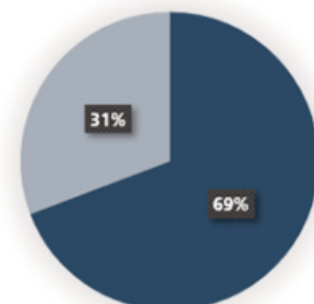
Career Planning and Placement Portal

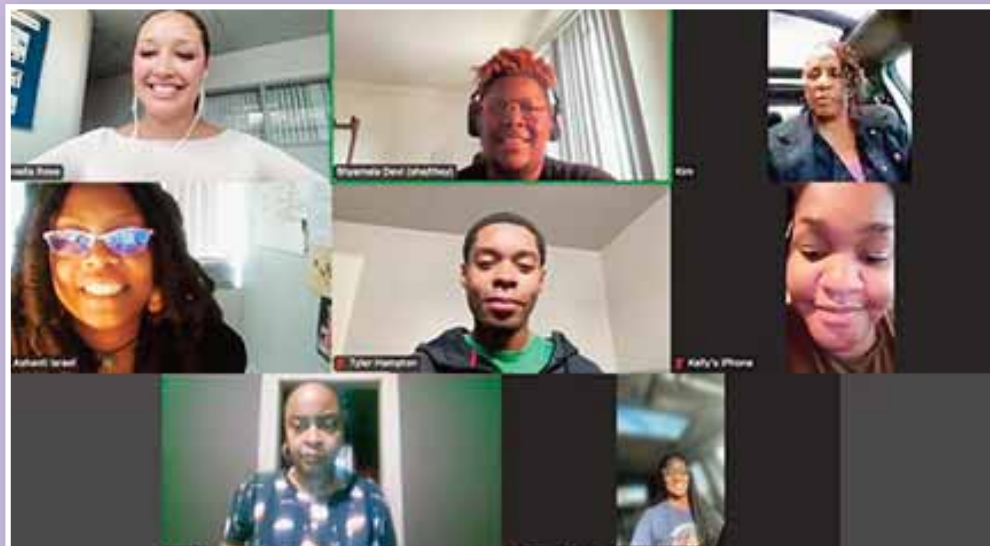
Uswa Sial was one of five WCCCD students who participated in a month-long research internship at Michigan Technological University.

We continue to accept new and gently used clothing donations for the Professional Closet. Students are able to select the appropriate clothing for job interviews and career opportunities.



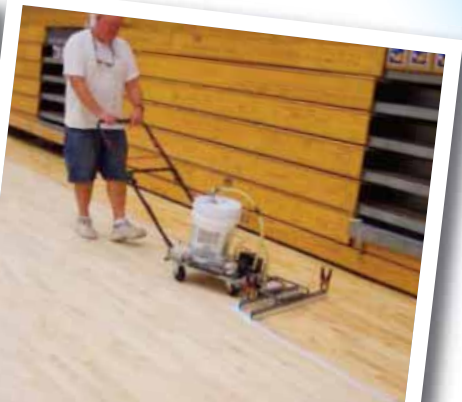
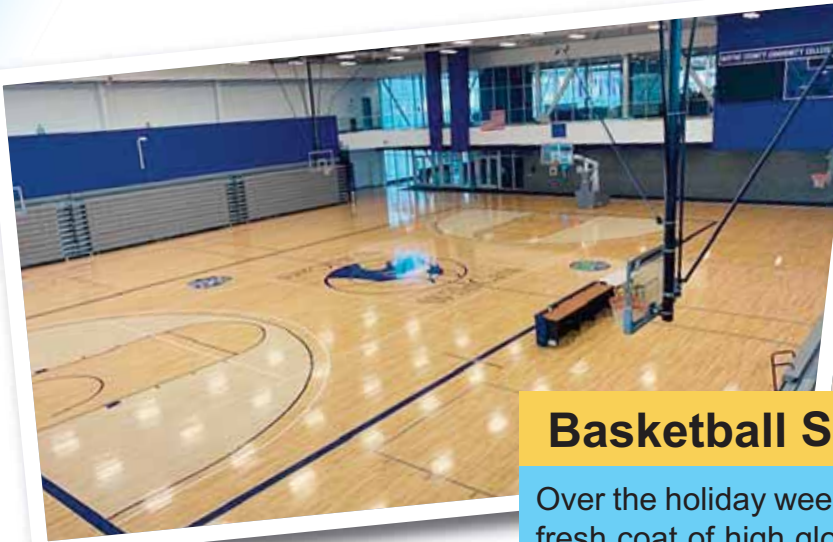
