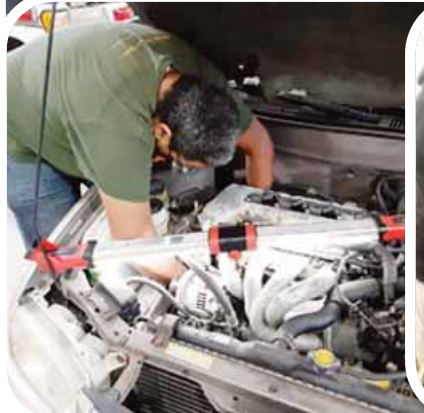




## *Student Success!* Taylor Dual Enrollment Automotive Class

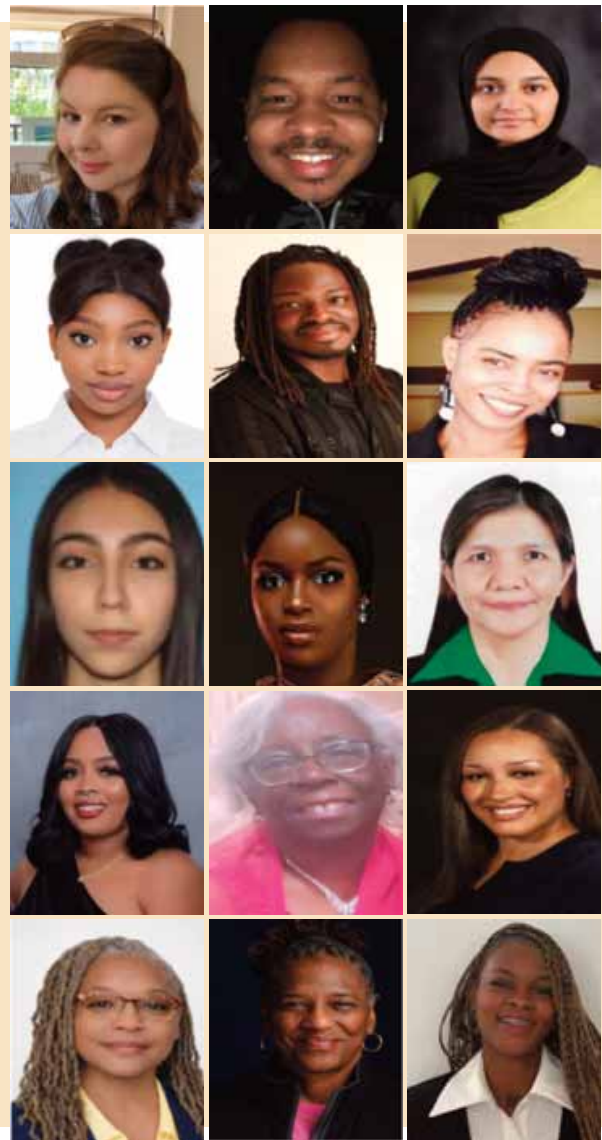

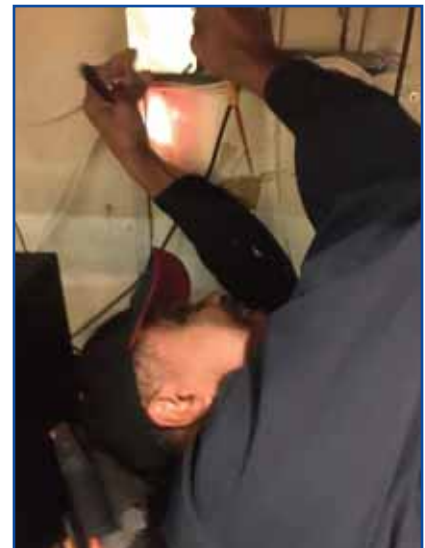
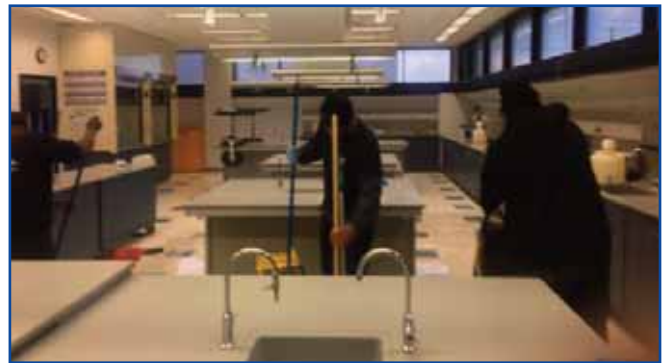

## Spring 2026 Continuing Education Schedule Available on our Website!

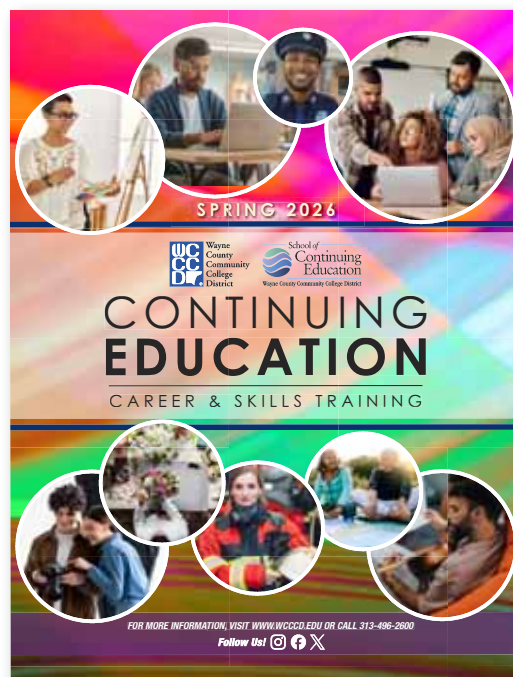

The School of Continuing Education is pleased to announce new course offerings for SCECH's.

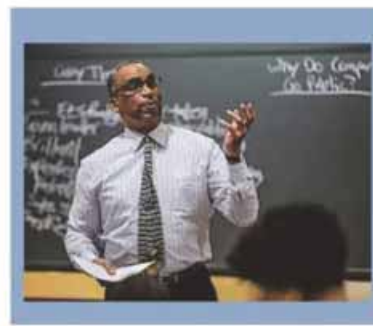
