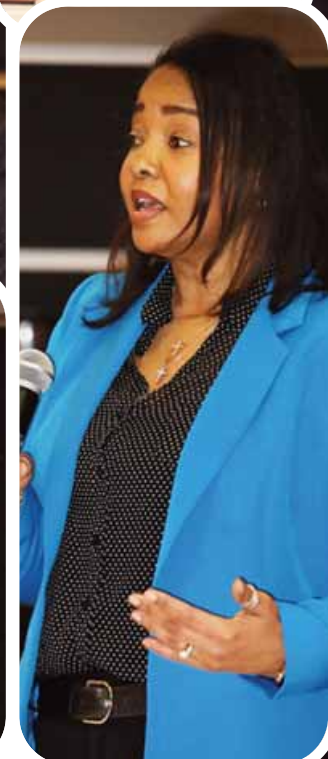
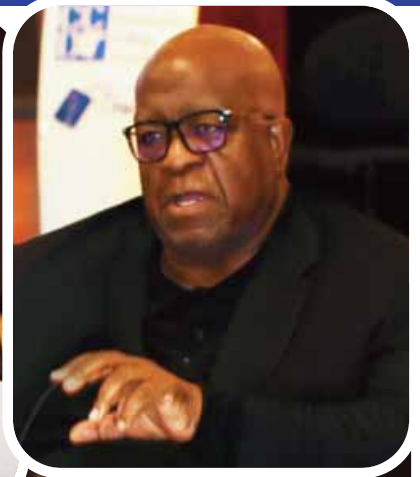

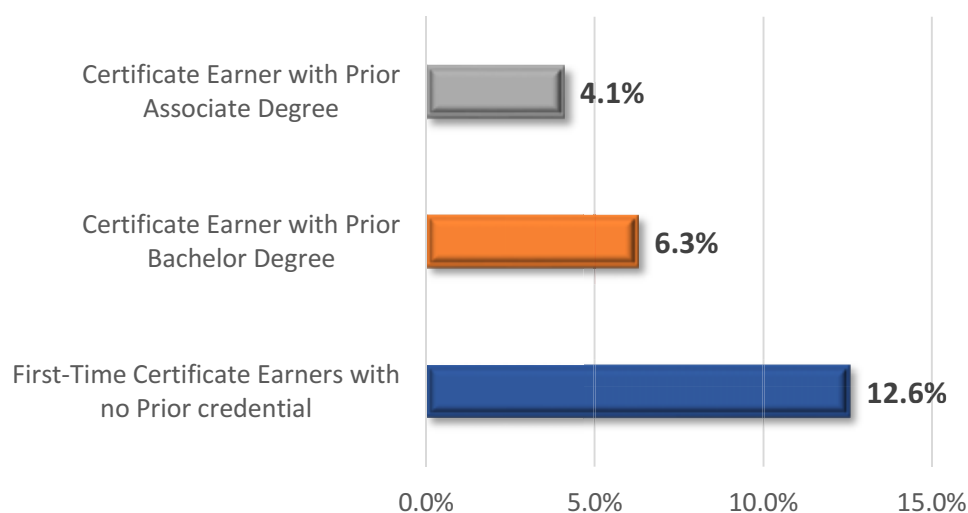




Division of Institutional Effectiveness

The Division of Institutional Effectiveness (IE) analyzes labor market trends and student outcomes to assess how well the District meets evolving student needs. Recent research shows significant growth in certificate attainment, with students increasingly favoring shorter-term, low-cost credentials over associate degrees—especially in high-demand, high-wage fields. Below highlights National research related to undergraduate degree earners growing demand for certificates in high-demand, high-wage areas.

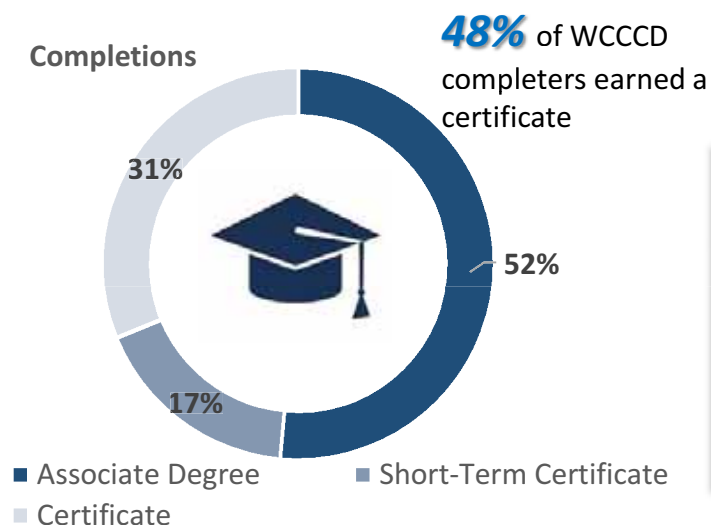
Certificate Earners Percent Increase

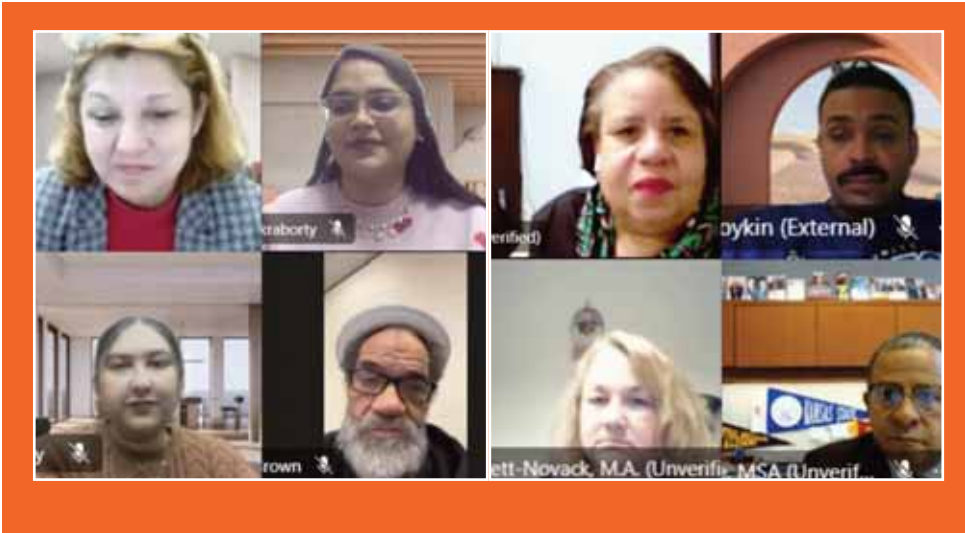

Continuing Her Mother's Legacy at WCCCD

My mother, known by her friends and family as “Cindy,” earned an Associate of Science from WCCCD in 1995, graduating with honors, special recognition, as an active member of Phi Theta Kappa Society, and was the spokesperson of her class.

Sadly, she passed away from a years-long battle with lung cancer in 2021, at the age of 65.

While sifting through the belongings she had left behind, I found a storage container full of keepsakes from her time at WCCCD; including notes, assignments, booklets, pamphlets, ribbons, tassels, sashes, plaques, and more (I have attached photos of some of these items).

It moved me deeply to remember the days when, as a single working mother, she poured her heart so fully into getting a college degree under her circumstances. She grew up in severe poverty and endured many hardships throughout her young adult life, but never gave up on her dream to get a higher education in environmental sciences.

There were many times over her years at WCCCD when she didn’t have a babysitter, and she would bring my younger sister and I with her to college. I remember walking in and gazing up in awe at the wide open upper levels, sitting in the back of the classrooms drawing, being set up with desks in the hallway, and sometimes getting to peek with curiosity at different objects and equipment in science labs.

We visited the Ted Scott Campus with her the most, as at that time, we lived just around the corner at the Parkwood Townhouses in Belleville. We also made many trips to the Downriver Campus, where my sister and I would explore the walking paths in the woods behind the building with wonder or play on the layered, round cement structure that we affectionately nicknamed “the big cake.”

It brings me great joy to know that when I enter the buildings at WCCCD, I am quite literally tracing the footsteps of my mother from decades before, when she was in the prime of her life. The nostalgia is not only comforting for me — it keeps her memory alive.

Looking back, I remember feeling important at the campuses. I remember feeling like I was a part of something big in the community. I remember looking up to my mom for her involvement there, even long before I fully understood the depth of her commitment and the sacrifices she made.

She was passionate about WCCCD, and I know I will be, too.

The HWEC hosted the home varsity basketball game of the Jalen Rose Leadership Academy versus Voyageur Academy.

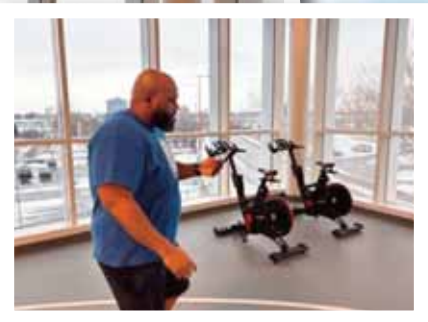


High School Basketball Tournament

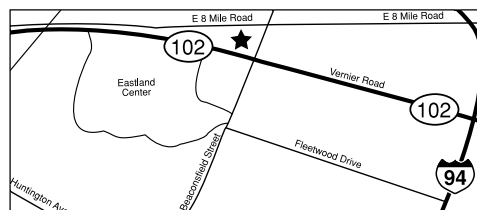
