ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Pre-Social Work Associate of Arts degree program provides a broad based two year Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree curriculum. The Pre-Social Work program is designed to:

- Provide a foundation in liberal arts coursework leading to a BSW degree at select four-year institutions.
- Prepare students for culturally competent, ethical, effective and accountable generalist social work practice.
- Provide academic support for the successful completion of the Pre-Social Work Associate of Arts degree while preparing for future educational and employment opportunities.
- Instill a knowledge base of the basic foundations of social work practice: purpose and mission, sanctions, values and ethics, knowledge and methods and skills.



PAY

The median annual wage for social workers was \$50,470 in May 2019.

JOB OUTLOOK

Employment of social workers is projected to grow 11 percent from 2018 to 2028, much faster than the average for all occupations. Employment growth will be driven by increased demand for health care and social services, but will vary by specialty.

WHAT DO SOCIAL WORKERS DO?

There are two main types of social workers: direct-service social workers, who help people solve and cope with problems in their everyday lives, and clinical social workers, who diagnose and treat mental, behavioral, and emotional issues.

WHERE DO THEY WORK?

Social workers work in a variety of settings, including mental health clinics, schools, hospitals, and private practices. They generally work full-time and may need to work evenings and weekends.
