The Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge is located along the lower Detroit River and western shoreline of Lake Erie, just 20 miles south of Detroit and 50 miles north of Toledo, Ohio. Situated in a major metropolitan area, the refuge's location is truly unique as it works to protect over 6000 acres of critical habitat across over 40 miles of the Detroit River.

Although the John D. Dingell Jr. Visitor Center is currently closed for public visitation, the grounds around the facility are open for self-guided visitation seven days a week during daylight hours. 5437 West Jefferson Ave., Trenton, MI 48183.
